Hello out there! A few things are happening that you should know about.

You've all heard about Anita Bryant's campaign of hate which is spreading all over North America. It's something to be alarmed about. On the enclosed sheet there are some ideas on

what it is all about and what you can do. No one but YOU is going to take the steps neccessary to stop her.

At our June 15th meeting we had intended to hold a values session on relationships. We talked instead about Anita and what she means to us. We were informed that a petition has been created, addressed to Prime Minister Trudeau, from the concerned hetero and homosexual citizens of Canada. The petition states that the issue is one of job security rather than of children, and urges Mr. Trudeau to implement human rights for all Canadians. It is hoped that this position will be endorsed by the labour movement, which has been supportive in the past. - 1. GET ANITA OFF THE AIR! EVERY time you see an Anita ad on TV, call the station and tell them that she is a bigot and that you don't want to see her on Canadian TV. IT REALLY WORKS!

- 2. GET ANITA FIRED! Send letters to the Florida Citrus Commission telling them you won't buy any more citrus until she goes. If she is fired, it will downgrade her public image and prestige. The address is:

- 4. KEEP ANITA BRYANT OUT OF CANADA! If it sannounced that she is coming to CANADA, write the federal Minister of Immigration as well as your federal member, and request that she be denied entry on the following grounds:

a) she is preaching hate about a significant number of Canadians, over 2 million in fact.
