



History Conference is being held at the same time, July 3- July 7, 1985. in Toronto. The history conference is titled- SEX AND THE STATE- THEIR LAWS, OUR LIVES.

The conference draws gays and lesbians from all over the world. This is the second conference to be held in North America. It is an event that is not to be missed.

Registration will allow you to participate in dozens of workshops and discussion groups on personal, political, health and other issues with other gay people from outside Canada. Registration will also give you special discounts or free admission to some of the most exciting lesbian and gay cultural events that Toronto has seen, and entry to all the history conference activities.

Possible workshops at the conference will include: Lesbian and gay teachers, sexual ethics, coming out, lesbian and gay youth, gay men and lesbians of colour, AIDS and our community, organizing in the eighties, lesbians in sports, gays, lesbians and censorship, creating our culture. Throughout the week, there will be on-going films and videos, panel discussions, dances (one especially for women), Celebrsian-a community variety show- ending with a huge picnic at a nearby community farm. The week will start on Saturday, June 29th with a large dance, followed by the annual Lesbian and Gay Pride Day.
