

On Tues. Dec 10, the General Meeting was held. It was proposed that there be a constitutional amendment regarding the elections.

The motion is as follows:

Move to amend Article VII Elections and Terms of Office.

Section (b) reads: Elections will take place once per year at the General Meeting during the first week of April.

Change this to read: Elections will take place once per year at the General Meeting during the first week of FEBRUARY.

Section (c) reads: Notice of the elections will be given at the General Meeting during the first week of February. Nominations, in writing, will be accepted four weeks prior to the election, up to and including the day of the election.

Change this to read: Notice of the election will be given at the General Meeting in the first week of December. Nominations, in writing, will be accepted four weeks prior to the election, up to and including the day of the election.

Section (j) reads: In the case of any vacancy on the Executive Committee during the electoral term, the other members of the Executive Committee shall appoint a member to complete the term of the vacant position.

Change this to read: In the case of any vacancy on the Fxecutive Committee during the electoral term, the other members of the Executive Committee shall appoint a member to complete the term of the vacant position. At the next General Meeting, there will be a by-election to confirm or alter this appointment.

Add section (1): The term shall be from April to April. The Executive elected in February will work in conjunction with the old Executive, the new Executive Committee will officially take office in April.
