Safety tips for gay men and lesbians

USE COMMON SENSE

Try to leave bars/clubs/community centres with people - preferably friends.

If you leave with someone you've just met, introduce him or her to a friend or even the bartender. Make sure that person knows you've told other people that you're leaving together.

If you are unsure about leaving with someone - don't.

When at gay and lesbian establishments, be alert and be aware of your surroundings. Don't assume you are in a safe place. Walk on well lit streets when there are people and traffic.

Avoid shubbery or doorways that might hide an attacker.

Be bold. Don't be afraid to scream before trouble begins.

Give yourself permission to be "impolite" or "over cautious".

You don't have to talk to strangers who approach you.

Be aware of who is behind you; cross the street or let them pass you.

TIPS FOR SAFETY

Attackers expect a passive victim. Carry a whistle in your pocket.

While cruising carry as little money, no jewellery and only identification which does not have your address.

If you feel unsafe, trust your instincts and act accordingly or leave!

If you see someone being hassled - help them or call for help.

Take a self-defence course and practice with a friend.

WHAT TO DO IF YOUR ARE ASSAULTED

Call police as soon as possible - Dial 911 - tell them that you have been assaulted. If your keys are stolen with identification:

- don't return home alone;
- if you have a roommate, call home and tell him or her;
- replace your locks.

Seek medical help if necessary.

Have any police office you speak with provide you with his or her name, badge number and your file number.

Don't be ashamed - ask a friend to be with you as soon as possible.

Try to detail on paper a description of the attackers and the incident.

Seek help. Call the Gayline which can help you with referral to:


- counselling;
- legal advice and the police;
- confidential or anonymous documenting of the assault;

Ask that charges be laid if your attacker is caught.





The International Gay Men's Newsletter (IGMN)

The International Gay Men's Newsletter is celebrating it's first anniversary. Since its conception, the newsletter has focused its attention on a wide cross section of Gay men. The founders, Steve Helton and Paul Murphy, have strived to provide all Gay men with an opportunity to meet each other for friendships or relations without discrimination as to size, age, race, nationality or physical challenge. The newsletter fills its thirty-six pages plus with over one hundred and fifty personals (growing by twenty to forty each month), Gay celebrity news, and extensive worldwideevents calendar, , Gay news from around the globe, special interest articles, letters to the editor, reviews and countries and cities from a Gay perspective, recipes, feature stories, advertisements and special inserts from Gay businesses.

The newsletter provides translation services for several languages including French, German, Russian and soon to offer Spanish, Greek and Italian. Language classes are sponsored by IGMN to break down language barriers between Gay men.

These classes have a Gay perspective and concentrate on basic grammar and common Gay slang for the purpose of corresponding with Gay men in foreign countries.

As of this writing, the newsletter is distributed to 3,000 Gay men all over the world and is sold in over fifty bookstores in the US, Canada and Europe. The newsletter is available on tape for individuals needing this service.

From very humble beginnings the International Gay Men's Newsletter has grown dramatically in the past year. The secret to this success can be attributed to the focus of the newsletter, "Bringing Gay Men Together" and the dedication of the founders to end discrimination within the Gay community itself.


