West Hollywood, when they prohibited him from displaying the flag from his apartment balcony. Meanwhile, Baker is still in San Francisco, and still making more flags. (The Alyson Almanac)

Eight striped version

The first Rainbow Flag was designed in 1978 by Gilbert Baker, a San Francisco artist, who created the flag in response to a local activist's call for the need of a community symbol. (This was before the pink triangle was popularly used as a symbol of pride.) Using the five-striped "Flag of the Race" as his inspiration, Baker designed a flag with eight stripes. Baker dyed and sewed the material for the first flag himself — in the true spirit of Betsy Ross.

The design may have been influenced by flags with multicolored stripes used by various leftwing causes and organizations in the San Francisco area in the 1960s. The Rainbow Flag originally had eight stripes (from top to bottom: hot pink for sex, red for life, orange for healing, yellow for sun, green for serenity with nature, turquoise for art, indigo for harmony, and violet for spirit). Handmade versions of this flag were flown in the 1978 Gay Freedom Day Parade.

Baker had hand-dyed the colours and upon

seeking to mass-produce the flag found that the pink colour was not available. The flag then became a seven-striped one until 1978. Following the assassinations of San Francisco Mayor George Moscone and openly gay Supervisor Harvey Milk the Rainbow Flag began to be used in San Francisco as a general symbol of the gay community, the 1979 Pride Parade Committee decided to use Baker's flag. The committee eliminated the indigo stripe so

they could divide the colors evenly along the parade route. This is how we ended up with the six-stripe version that we have today.

So all these years later, here in Waterloo-Wellington, we decided t o

m a k e the cover of this di-

rectory tourquois and the colour of our Pride Guide (which will be available Pride Weekend) Pink, as a way of honouring the history of The Rainbow Flag. Our flag may not have pink and tourquois stripes anymore but we as a community have not lost any pride in our orientations, sexuality or creative art. So the pink and the tourquois are with us in spirit as strongly as ever even though they are not a formal part of this very meaningful symbol of our PRIDE anymore.

Which side is up?

There is no "right side up" for this flag. It may be flown either red up or purple up. This information comes directly form Gilbert Baker, the gay artist who conceived of the "The Rainbow Flag" as a symbol of Gay Pride.




