

#### MESSAGE FROM ANDREW TELEGOI


Dear Friends,

#### STUTTER

Like Blondie dry-humping No Doubt in the backseat of Billy Idol's car, Stutter smashes pop, new wave, rock and dance into a fresh and explosive new sound.

The much-anticipated debut, produced by Alex Greggs (Brittney Spears and N'Sync) and mixed by Rich Chycki (Pink and Simple Plan) is in stores now. The video for Twenty-One is on MuchMoreMusic and the band is out touring Canada to support its release.

#### **EMBER SWIFT**

Indie music sensation Ember Swift's particular brand of politically charged folk-jazz-funk music has garnered ardent fan frenzy and rave critical acclaim from across Canada, the U.S., and Australia. Swift is a poignant songwriter, a prolific recording artist (eight albums and counting on her independent Few'll Ignite Sound label), a relentless touring artist (over 200 shows per year), a vibrant stage performer, and a fierce political and social activist.

Swift grew up in both Burlington and Woodstock, living in Ottawa for a time, and now resides in Toronto. A self-taught guitarist, percussionist, "mother-taught" vocalist and trained pianist through the Royal Conservatory of music, Swift has been writing songs since she was nine years old and performing since she was 10.

Her first professional live show took place in Ottawa, but it was only after moving to Toronto and immersing herself in the music scene there that Swift met her soon-to-be integral band-mate, Lyndell Montgomery. In 1997, as a four-piece band, Ember headed out on her first tour of the east coast of Canada.

#### DR. DRAW

When Eugene Draw was still busking for a living, people working in the office towers nearby often called the joyful musician "doctor." He had the ability to cure the common blues and uplift the spirits of even the most cynical passerby. If positive energy has been a consistent element of Dr. Draw's career, then genre bending is certainly another trademark. In fact, his renditions of classical masterpieces as well as his original compositions defy singular classification. Unfettered by music's traditional boundaries. Dr. Draw and his talented band pull together an organic blend of instruments that satisfies eclectic audiences.

Added to Draw's violin strings are the instruments of his musical collective; an award-winning guitarist, electronic keyboard specialist, electric harpist, rock bassist and drummer. Citing such diverse influences at Chopin, Charles Minges, David Bowie and Pink Floyd, Dr. Draw comes by his unique musical masala honestly. Elements of African percussion, Indian Ragas, North American Folk music and Reggae all find their place here and there throughout Dr. Draw's compositions. Born in Moscow to a family immersed in classical music, the young boy learned the power and drama of performance from his ballerina mother. He practised his beloved violin, sometimes up to six hours a day, hardly willing to stop for breaks. When Draw's parents moved to Canada, he was enrolled at the prestigious Royal Conservatory of Music. Ultimately constrained by the school's formal approach to music, Draw left the institution in favour of the street where he was free to improvise and experiment. Draw has been based the last two years in Montreal as part of the city's burgeoning music scene. At just 23 years old, Dr. Draw is assuming his place among only a handful of artists with the charisma and talent to command attention from so many important and diverse stages.

#### **GREG UPSHAW**

Soul and Folk mix seamlessly with Greg Upshaw. His songwriting style is steeped in the tradition of Gordon Lightfoot and Joni Mitchell, accompanied by the voice, at times soulful, other times flat out soul shouting. Either way, this blending of styles brings Upshaw's creative energy to the forefront and becomes a unique listening experience. Originally heralding from Toronto, Upshaw now calls Cambridge his home. His first release, Cinchy, shows Upshaw as a thoughtful and passionate writer and performer. Having made the trek to Nashville, TN, Upshaw's performance at the legendary Bluebird Cafe was a thrill and a highlight. With the release of his band's first self-titled EP, Upshaw is climbing the musical ladder thanks to his steadily increasing and loval fan base.

#### **CHARLENA RUSSELL**

A powerhouse vocalist and adept multi-instrumentalist. Charlena Russell uses her musical and vocal training and penchant for poetry to create fiery, soulful acoustic-rock and haunting, personal electronica. Russell is a trained vocalist, trumpet player, violinist and self-taught guitarist. She was working at a music store and a live music venue/pub when she met goth/electronic outfit. Puncture Vine, and became their electric violinist and back-up singer. She slept on the floor of the studio while Puncture Vine recorded its first album. The band broke up shortly after a successful CD release. Russell was also co-vocalist and trumpet player in the funk-groove band Six Foot Groove, which sold out venues and opened for bands like The Pocket Dwellers before band politics led to its demise. Never one to rest, Russell works, teaches violin and guitar, and is co-producing her debut album.

#### MARY 5E

She was a badass girl living in a small town drinking, drugging, and committing petty criminal acts. That is, until the music fairy saved her life. Mary 5e plays personal, dark-edged hard rock

and acoustic rock songs with memorable melodies and exquisite harmonies. When Mary moved to Kitchener, a regular café gig brought her into the stead of guitarist, John Stuart, with whom she formed a band and began gigging. Before the release of her debut full-length, Made of Gold, in 2004, Mary recorded low-budget demos, which she used to finagle attention from established artists. Over the years, Mary has become a more confident songwriter and took vocal lessons to learn proper technique and strengthen her already powerful voice. A self-taught guitarist, drummer, and bassist, Mary has never taken a music lesson. She doesn't know any notes or chord names, and she prefers it that way. Music is Mary's biggest passion, and she admits that it's her only option. "I have to do music," she said. "I have no choice and I kind of made it that way." With nothing to fall back on, she must fall forward.

They are women who play percussion; who bring to audiences a complex conversation between instruments, communicating the lives and rituals of women, to all who listen. Drumming is their passion. Inspiring audiences to get up and move as the music moves them, is their mission. Their music harnesses the raw power of the drum and blends it with the healing, sensual nature of rhythm.

#### tri-Pride: A History

1995 In the spring of 1995, a group of people active in the Kitchener-Waterloo LGBT communities met to organize the first local pride celebration ever to be held in the area. Unfortunately, it began to appear that the event would not take place. Just one week before the original date, Darryl Bender took it upon himself to pull things back together, and the event did, in fact, take place in the Rotunda of Kitchener City Hall. With such limited time for publicizing the event, it was astonishing that 86 people showed up.

1996 People were in favour of having a second celebration covering not only Kitchener-Waterloo, but Cambridge and Guelph as well. An initial meeting of what came to be called the Regional Pride Committee (RPC) was held in late April 1996. At that time, the committee included members of GLOW, ACCKWA, Out & About gay radio show, Guelph Queer Equality, and the Rainbow Metropolitan Community Church in Guelph. The second Pride Celebration, Triangle Unity '96, was attended by 221 people.

1997 Preparations for Regional Pride '97 saw a significant step forward over the previous year's celebration. In 1996, there were only two business sponsors for the event. In 1997, there were several dozen.

1998 In 1998, Pride Celebrations moved outdoors for the first time ever. It was a very successful day. Out and About radio taped a show during the day in the park. There were speakers and music along with many information tables. Out-'98 was held in Kitchener's Victoria Park by the clock tower. While spirits were high, shade was nowhere to be found on this very hot and sunny day.

1999 In 1999, the Pride Celebration moved from the clock tower area of Kitchener's Victoria Park to the centre of the park, Roos Island. Pride '99, dubbed, Rock the Island! Celebrate Diversity was attended by over 500 people. There were information tables, a BBQ, a beer garden, and a variety of entertainment with lots of music.

2000 In 2000, the Pride Celebration was again held on Roos Island in Kitchener's Victoria Park. Attendance was estimated to be about the same as 1999. Again, there were information tables, a beer garden, BBQ, entertainment and lots of music.


**2001** The 2001 Pride Celebration followed in the footsteps of earlier years, again at Roos Island. Titled Imagine: Be A Dreamer, it once again featured a beer garden, BBQ, music, various entertainers and lots of information tables.


2002 Pride 2002: There's No Place Like Home! featured an art show, community dance, a number of workshops and the traditional Sunday afternoon event on Roos Island were held, with about 2,000 people in attendance. In August, the Waterloo-Wellington Regional Pride Committee increased it's numbers to 10 directors and incorporated in March to become *tri*-Pride Community Association Inc.

2003 Canadian music icon and legend, Carole Pope, headlined the stage show. Pride Day 2003 also hosted a display and closing ceremonies of The Canadian AIDS Memorial Quilt. The theme, Tribes, celebrated the differences within our community.

2004 Pride's theme for the year was Evolution: a brand new universe, recognizing new-found gay and lesbian rights with the legalization of gay marriage. Pride Week now included a bowling tournament and LESBO Bingo, as well as a further-developed children's activity area for Pride Day. The stage show once again featured some of the best Canadian gay and lesbian performers and attendance exploded to 3,000 people on the island.

2005 Decades celebrated its 10th anniversary. With over 3,000 people in attendance and the stage line-up, headlined by Ashley MacIsaac, it was the best Pride yet. What a way to go into retirement for three of *tri*-Pride's longest serving board members, Dave Olesen, Rick Sickinger and Melody Alderwick. Do they ever know how to throw a party!




